

Notes on Norwegian Coleoptera 5

The following seven species of Coleoptera are recorded for the first time in Norway: *Cercyon bifenerstratus* Kuster, 1851 (Hydrophilidae), *Stenus pallitarsis* Stephens, 1833, *Ocalea badia* Erichson, 1837 (Staphylinidae), *Dermestes haemorrhoidalis* (Küster, 1852) (Dermestidae), *Scymnus ater* (Kugelann, 1794) (Coccinellidae), *Melandrya barbata* (Fabricius, 1787) (Melandryidae) and *Otiorhynchus rugosostriatus* (Goeze, 1777) (Curculionidae). The complex of the two sibling species *Anthonomus brunnipennis* Curtis, 1840 and *A. rubi* Herbst, 1795 (Curculionidae) are revised. Noteworthy records are given for the following species: *Porotachys bisulcatus* (Nicolai, 1822), *Bradyceillus verbasci* (Duftschmid, 1812), *Perigona nigriceps* (Dejean, 1831) (Carabidae), *Gabrius tirolensis* (Luzé, 1903), *Deleaster dichroeus* (Gravenhorst, 1802) (Staphylinidae), *Prionocyphon serraticornis* (Müller, 1821) (Scirtidae), *Gymnetron melanarium* (Germar, 1821) and *Xyleborinus saxeseni* (Ratzeburg, 1837) (Curculionidae).
